WELLBEING NEWS

Embedding the GSPS Pillars and Proverbs at Home

At GSPS, our Pillars and Proverbs provide a shared language for learning, wellbeing and personal growth. When this language is reinforced at home, children have more opportunities to connect their experiences, reflect on their actions and develop a deeper understanding of themselves and others.



One of our Emotional Intelligence (EQ) Proverbs is "**Do good to feel good!**" This simple but powerful message helps children understand the connection between positive actions and positive emotions. We encourage students to notice when they feel good about themselves and to think carefully about *why* they feel that way. Was it because they helped a classmate? Included someone in a game? Completed a challenging task? Showed kindness to a family member? By identifying the activity, action or act of service that contributed to those positive feelings, children begin to recognise that wellbeing is often connected to contributing positively to the lives of others.

At school, students may experience this feeling after helping a peer learn a new skill, participating positively in group work, demonstrating persistence with a difficult task, caring for the environment, or showing kindness and respect to others. At home, opportunities might include helping with household jobs, supporting a sibling, showing gratitude, saying hello to a neighbour, caring for a pet, or completing responsibilities without being asked.

Families can help strengthen this learning by regularly asking questions such as:

- *What made you feel good about yourself today?*
- *What did you do that contributed to that feeling?*
- *Did you help someone today?*
- *How did your actions make a difference to another person?*

Using rich, descriptive emotional vocabulary is also important. Rather than simply saying "good" or "happy," encourage children to describe their feelings more precisely. Words such as **proud**, **accomplished**, **helpful**, **kind**, **responsible**, **confident**, and **thoughtful** help children develop greater emotional awareness and expression.

When discussing feelings such as pride, it can also be helpful to notice the physical signs that accompany the emotion. Children might describe standing a little taller, smiling, lifting their head, making eye contact, or feeling a sense of warmth and energy. Recognising these physical cues helps young people better identify and understand their emotions when they occur.

By using the GSPS Pillars and Proverbs at home, families can help create a consistent language that strengthens learning, emotional intelligence and positive character development. Together, we can support our young people to understand that doing good for others not only benefits the community around them but also contributes to their own sense of pride, purpose and wellbeing.

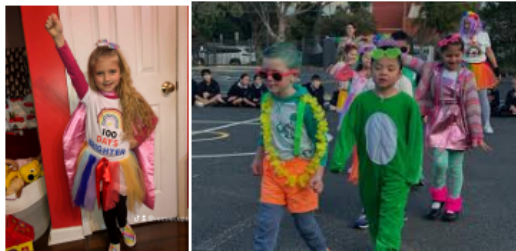
100 Days of Foundation
