# GUTHRIE STREET PRIMARY SCHOOL SOCIAL & EMOTIONAL WELL BEING MANUAL

As human beings we often respond emotionally first and rationally second. Emotions have the greatest influence on our behaviour. Knowing about human emotions and understanding why and how they occur allows us to better regulate, manage and change our own behaviour.

At Guthrie Street Primary School all classrooms explicitly teach students about their emotions and how to manage them. All classrooms complete an EQ lesson weekly which can include lessons, games and activities to learn about Emotional Intelligence. To complement our EQ program, students complete activities from the Respectful Relationships program and the Resilience Project.

Self-Awareness, Self-Control, Self-Motivation, Empathy and Building Relationships are the pillars of emotional intelligence, and constitute the pathway to health, happiness and success.

When students behave inappropriately it is because emotions have taken over from reason. At Guthrie Street, we teach students how to be the master of their feelings, rather than a victim of their feelings.

The school teaches students about a number of proverbs to embrace the EQ way. The Golden Rule of EQ, "Treat others the way you would like to be treated" is referred to many times in classrooms and taught explicitly across the school.

Along side our EQ program, Guthrie Street Primary School teaches Respectful Relationships Curriculum which involves promoting and modelling respect, positive attitudes and behaviours. It teaches our children how to build healthy relationships, resilience and confidence.

## Guthrie Street Primary School Student Rights & Responsibilities

#### Students have the right to-

- Learn and achieve to their individual potential
- Be accepted as an individual andfeel safe
- Be treated and spoken to fairly and respectfully by teachers, students and parents
- Learn and play in a clean and tidy environment
- Have a voice within our school

### Students are expected to-

- Allow others to learn and play without interference
- Accept others as individuals with different backgrounds, personalities and interests
- Treat and speak to teachers, students and parents in a fair and respectful manner
- Listen to and value others opinions and ideas

### Guthrie Street Primary School Teacher Rights & Responsibilities

### Teachers have the right to-

- Be treated with respect by students, parents and colleagues
- Feel safe in the school environment

#### Teachers are responsible for-

- Maintaining a classroom environment where all children have the opportunity to learn and play without interference from others
- Treating students, parents and colleagues how they would like to be treated
- Discussing and reinforcing school rules and expectations
- Being fair and consistent when dealing with student management and behaviour issues
- Providing appropriate levels of supervision inside and outside of the classroom

### Guthrie Street Primary School Parent Rights & Responsibilities

#### Parents have the right to-

- Know their child is safe
- Be kept informed of their child's learning progress and behaviour at school

### Parents are responsible for-

- Being aware of the school rules and encouraging acceptable behaviour
- Providing school with up to date information about their child including family arrangements, personal information and contact information
- Ensuring your child attends school regularly and punctually and provides explanations for school absences
- Sending their child to school in the correct school uniform
- Following their children's academic progress by attending parent teacher interviews,
   viewing school reports and keeping in contact with the classroom teacher

iPads and mobile phones are not used in the yard, before or after school. Mobile Phones must be signed in at the front office when a student arrives at school every day	iPad will be confiscated by a yard duty teacher	
We do not swing on the soccer goals, netball, basketball or football goals. We do not climb fences or trees	Student's are reminded about safety.  Repeat Offenders 10 minutes time-out on a seat

Rules	Consequences

We do not tease, bully or harass	Withdrawal from the yard for Re-Think or Suspension

Refusal to follow teacher instructions is not permitted.	
Swearing directed at a teacher will not be tolerated.	Withdrawal from the yard for Re-Think <b>or</b> Suspension
Prohibited items must not be brought to school including knives, vapes, cigarettes and any other items that can cause harm to self and others	Withdrawal from the yard for Re-Think or Suspension
Tackling in football games is allowed. Sling tackles are not allowed.	Students who tackle rough or sling tackle will have time out on the seat. Repeat offenders will be removed from the yard.

i) Please note, parents will not be contacted on every occasion a student has a consequence. The Principal will use discretion as to when to contact parents for different incidents.

### Play Areas

Foundation and Grade 1s only will use the playground behind the library. The two other playgrounds are for Grades 2-6 only.

Oval- The large soccer goals field will be used by Grade 56 students, 34 students will use the field near rebound wall, the soccer field closest to the library will be used by Grade 1/2 students.

## NOTE:

- 1) If a child is removed to the office the Principal will decide whether it is <u>also</u> appropriate to organise a meeting with the classroom teacher, the child and his/her parents to discuss their classroom behaviour.
- 2) When determining whether suspension will be used as a consequence for a child removed to the office, the Principal will take into account
  - i. the severity of the incident
  - ii. whether the behaviour has been addressed previously.
- 3) If a child is removed to another classroom or the office parents will be informed by phone or via Compass notification
